

## Erik Allardt Fellowship 2018–2019

The purpose of the Erik Allardt Fellowship Programme is to further and strengthen academic and cultural exchanges between Sweden and Finland within a context of high quality research in the social and human sciences. The programme was created by Helsinki Collegium for Advanced Studies (HCAS) and the Swedish Collegium for Advanced Study (SCAS). It is funded by Stiftelsen Riksbankens Jubileumsfond.

For the academic year 2018–2019, the Swedish Collegium for Advanced Study (SCAS) offers residential fellowships for one or two scholars with a tenured or long-term position in Finland.

Candidates may come from any discipline within the humanities and social sciences and neighbouring scholarly fields. Early career as well as senior scholars are welcome to apply. Candidates must be at least three years beyond their doctoral degree by the time of application. The application may be for the entire academic year (September 2018 – mid-June 2019) or alternatively for one academic semester (September – mid-December 2018 or mid-January – mid-June 2019).

### Facilities and Services at SCAS

Founded in 1985, the Swedish Collegium for Advanced Study is chartered by the Government of Sweden. It is a national institute for advanced study, mainly in the social sciences and the humanities. It is located in the late eighteenth-century Linneanum and an adjacent late nineteenth-century villa in the middle of the Botanic Garden in Uppsala.

Accommodation for Fellows is arranged by the Collegium and all Fellows have their own fully-equipped office. The collections of Carolina Rediviva Library and other scientific facilities at Uppsala University are situated nearby. Books are delivered directly to the Collegium by the university library. Weekly seminars serve as a focus of shared activities. In addition, lectures, colloquia and other intellectual encounters offer opportunities for interaction as do the lunches each weekday and excursions and other social and cultural events.

## Stipends

The holder of the fellowship receives a monthly stipend, the size of which will be decided after consultation with the applicant and a consideration of relevant circumstances. Costs for housing and lunches are also covered.

## Deadline and Application Procedures

An applicant should submit a curriculum vitae (4 pages maximum); a research proposal (5 to 10 pages); a list of publications; three articles, including a brief rationale for selecting the articles (100 words maximum per article). Applicants may also submit up to 3 letters of reference.
